

SECOND SATURDAY

The word tells us we will always have the poor among us and you have extended food, clothing and services to families in the community who face scarcity daily. The March food pantry provided food for 63 families that included 278 persons; 147 adults and 131 children. We also had a great supply of warm clothing and other items. Thank you for your sharing the need with your children and neighbors and pray that all will be enriched by God's grace, mercy and love.

Other services provided included screening by Med-Star Montgomery for blood pressure, sucrose and cholesterol. Community Ministry provided health literature and information about the Kasey clinic in Rockville. Join Community Ministry for a community walk from March 7 to April 18 at 5:30 p.m. beginning at the Parkland entrance to the office.

Children coming to pantry received a Leprechaun puppet to color, cut and put together.

SMART SACKS

Nancy Gray and team are now packing 56 smart sacks weekly (224) for Wheaton Woods Elementary School for March. A total of 1,499 smart sacks have provided food for children who experience food scarcity on weekends.

COMMUNITY PART-NERS

Marguerite Eimer and team continues to plan activities for the year. Forty-eight pairs of socks filled with toiletries part of the Martin Luther King Service were delivered to homeless men and women. They also received knitted caps, scarves and gloves. Genesis Rest Home on Bel Pre Road received Valentines in February. The firemen received gorph. Health kits that were also part of the MLK project have not been delivered.

A diverse group of church and community men and women participated in the March workshop. made and tasted Irish Soda Bread with Edith Williams. She also did an inspirational presentation on "The Hidden Treasure" by Joyce Rupp which highlighted finding what is missing in our lives during Lent.
