## OUTREACH NEWS JANUARY 2019

JANUARY 2019, a new year, a fresh start, a new beginning at Millian building on a strong foundation of the past. As we speed into 2019, we must not forget the map/plans that will keep us on routes that will lead us to our goals

Outreach had a good year despite our financial shortfall. We had exceptional support from churches, community groups, i.e. Community Partners, Linkages to Learning, girl scouts, preschool; friends, neighbors, teens earning SSL hours, and of course you, our rock. We have provided marginal families predominantly in zip codes 20853 and 20906 with food, seasonal clothing, household goods, Thanksgiving Baskets, etc. Children have received school supplies, crafts, games, Easter Egg Roll, 4<sup>th</sup> of July Picnic, St. Nicholas Secret Shop, gifts from the Angel Tree, a team effort with Linkages to Learning at Parkland and Wheaton Woods and in partnership with Community Partners, End of School Celebration, Back to School Celebration and Martin Luther King Service.

We haven't had the cash flow to allow for payment to Second Mile Giving most of 2017 and 2018 the envelope was removed so that the congregation could increase giving to the general fund. Second Mile giving was given to local non

-profits and more recent to support church outreach to the community. Africa University is not budgeted; the support came from special offering for about eight years, we didn't have Africa University Sunday appeal because we were devoting all funds to the general fund therefore Millian didn't contribute to Africa University during 2018.

### **DECEMBER OUTREACH.**

Contributions to St. Nicholas Secret Shop and the angel tree was superb! Thanks so very much for making it possible for children on Second Saturday to select gifts for their parents for Christmas. It is our own free gift shop with so many lovely items to make choices. The children were elated to select gifts for their parents. The Angel Tree provided a total of 40 gifts to Parkland and Wheaton Woods schools, 10 gifts to Millian/community outreach and books/small gift to 6 children in a tutoring group at Wheaton Woods. The impact to these children we don't fully know, but for many your gifts is Christmas for them. Thank you for being so generous. Many of you took more than one child. I had two friends that each took a family of four, UMW made a cash donation for gifts and the

preschool provided gifts for 10 angels.

We had a great outreach to winter wear. The preschool collected coats for children and the family and generous donations from the church some unknown. The coats came during our coldest days and children and adults went out wearing them. Winter Wear were available on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Saturday November and December. There are still children without warm coats on these frigid days.

The food pantry provided food for 68 families reaching at total of 315; 161 adults and 157 children. We received food from St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church and a monetary donation of \$650 for the food pantry. We also received a cash donation of \$50 from a church friend. Please know that we still need your contribution of food or monetary support to continue the food pantry. Smart Sacks continue with Nancy Gray to provide 50 smart sacks a week to Wheaton Woods School. They will also double up to provide food for the winter break. This is another important outreach to our immediate community. Thanks,

Nancy, for a terrific job! Community Partners under the leadership of Marguerite Eimer is sponsoring

the annual MARTIN LUTHER KING SERVICE PROJECT, with emphasis on service projects for preschoolers as well as school age children. Middle and High School youth will receive SSL hours. All projects will be distributed to non-profits, nursing homes and other groups that provide service. Please come and observe/participate January 21, 1:00-3:00 pm in Fellowship Hall.

This wraps up 2018 and a long tenure for me with




