OUTREACH NEWS

2nd SATURDAY – Off to a good start!

Community families are still in need for food, clothing and other goods and services. We are thankful for the many people in the community who volunteer and contribute to support the work led by Millian Church. They come from many avenues, some known, others unknown. St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church goes to the top for the volume of food donated and over a thousand dollars in cash the past year to support the food pantry. There are pre-school families that bring in bags of food, pre-school employees who volunteer and make cash contributions. Community families contribute clothing and cash donations, and families who come to pantry for food giving back service. Teens earn SSL hours from public and private schools, girl scouts, boy scouts, their parents and Teen Café youth now in college returning to serve. Millian you are the base—giving in all categories plus others that are too numerous to list. Millian, we are so blessed and we cannot thank you enough for all you do.

Food Pantry. 65 families visited the food pantry serving a total of 296 persons; 179 adults, 117 children. A team of 13 adults and 7 teens managed the food pantry including purchasing and packing. Teen volunteers did some pre-preparation for MLK Day Service Projects.

SMART SACKS Wheaton Woods) –

Nancy Gray, Coordinator Packed for 5 weeks, 48 bags per week for 240 families. A team of 6 adults managed

this ministry.

MUM (Mid-County United Ministries)

Sunday, January 16 MUM provided food for families in the community from our Parking Lot from 2:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. 43 families received food. The director reported that this was their most successful site. They will return! This is an old relationship renewed. Before we established our food pantry we took our excess food to their office in Wheaton for distribution. Mum has served the community for 20 years.

Millian, we are making a difference in the community—in January working with other community groups 348 families received food. On Thursday, the Market Place at Parkland Middle School will add approximately 60 or more families to the above number.

THOMAS EDISON HIGH SCHOOL OF TECHNOLOGY.

A new program CREA (Career Readiness Education Academy) was launched this school year for older English Language Learners who are not on track to meet graduation requirements before age 21. This program allows students to work during the day and work on cognitive skills plus basic work skills and industry certificate in the evening. The unit on Foundations of Building Construction Technology (FBCT) where students learn skills in carpentry, need materials to support them. They need tool belts, hammers, measuring tapes, etc. If you have these items that you aren't using, please donate them so that

students can build their personal tool kit. We will place a box in the Chapel Room to collect items. Thanks for your cooperation!

COMMUNITY PARTNERS.

Marguerite Eimer, Chair Community Partners conducted their annual Martin Luther King Service Project. This event provides opportunity to children and adults in our community to participate in a service projects. Approximately 80 pairs socks were filled with grooming items, gloves, hats, etc. for the Men's Shelter on Gude Drive and the Women's Shelter recently located in the area, trail mix for the firemen on Bel Pre Drive, pencil valentines for Genesis Home on Bel Pre and Becky's House and refrigerator magnets. Warm clothing was available for adults and children, games, books, etc. A wonderful way to say Thank You/I Love you to the community. Participants and volunteers were treated to cookies, cocoa and popcorn. There were approximately 13 volunteers and 50 adults, youth and children. Teens earned SSL hours for participating.
