³⁴ "Then the King will say to those on his right, 'Come, vou who are blessed by my Father; take your inheritance, the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world. 35 For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, ³⁶ I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me.'

³⁷ "Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink?³⁸ When did we see you a stranger and invite you in, or needing clothes and clothe you? ³⁹ When did we see you sick or in prison and go to visit vou?' 40 "The King will reply, 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.'

My dear family we are in a process in which God directs us and stays with us in everything we do. And that's why I give God Glory. Remember that the work of the church is to serve others in the community that surrounds us, and this we have been doing diligently.

In the letter for Pentecost, I invited you to continue praying, to be faithful with your offerings and tithes, remembering all the blessings received. And now, my brothers and sisters in Christ, we continue walking and trusting in our Lord.

I share the steps we have taken at this time:

I. We have invited the congregation to direct their offerings and tithes to General Fund and not to Restricted Funds. Little by little we have advanced in this practice.

practice.
2. We continue to pay our contributions to the conference; as much as posible; when our finances allow it.

3. I must acknowledge and

congratulate the work of SPRC in reducing the functions and hours of the staff: positions of Music Director and Custodian. These changes will be reflected in the real budget for 2019.

4. We have approved the sale of our van, which was done diligently by trustees. Thank you for that good work.

5. It is my pleasure to inform you that the Social Hall (under the chapel) is in the process of being renewed (95% progress). In the immediate future this will generate income and be reflected in our real budget of 2019. This work has been done with our resources but with free labor of our brothers and sisters of the Church of God who have done it voluntarily. Thank God for our brothers and the pastor Carlos Lizama who directs them.

6. We are also in the middle of the process of choosing leaders for 2019, I ask you to continue praying with me, so that the people that God has chosen will say yes

to His call.

7. The "Single Board Church" has also been implemented as a model for our Church Council. Since we are a small church, it is the best way to administer the church.

8. As mentioned above, we are about to complete our real budget in which Millian ministries, focused on reaching the community, are considered.

My beloved family, I invite you to pray for each other. We have decided to live as

a church, and not put the church up for sale. It is also clear that the situation is not easy, rather it is complicated. That is why staying in prayer is a way to strengthened our communication with God.

We have definitely done a great job, but it is time to do better, in the face of radical situations, radical options. I firmly believe that we must focus on our outreach ministry to the community, and continue supporting our administra-

tive and financial decisions.

I reaffirm my invitation to pray for each other, since it is the only way to avoid the temptation of discouragement, pessimism, anger, gossip, and rumor, or pay attention to our fears.

God is with us!

BACKPACKS plus OTH-**SUPPLIES** ER for SCHOOL WERE RECEIVED BY COMMUNITY CHIL-DREN and Youth at "Backto-SCHOOL CELEBRA-TION". 2nd Saturday, September 8th Millian and Community Partners held their annual "Back to School Celebration that was well attended by adults and youth. Although school was open four days school supplies was the dominant station for children and adults. School supplies came from many sources, Community Partners, 4-H Families, MedStar Montgomery, Millian Church, Millian Pre-School, and the Montgomery County School Supply Give Away, Thanks to Brian McGahey for blessing the supplies and back to school. Other activities were free clothing, crafts, free books, snacks, and information on nutrition and health information.

THE FOOD PANTRY provided food for 62 families reaching 145 adults and 124 children. Volunteers from the community, Community Partners, Millian and 10 youth earning SSL hours contributed to the success

of the event. We also like to acknowledge food received from St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church in September.
